A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Invercargill Corporation Empowering Act, 1888." Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Invercargill Corporation Empowering Act 1888 Amendment Act, 1893." Short Title.

10 2. This Act shall be incorporated with and be read as part of "The Invercargill Corporation Empowering Act, 1888" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"). Incorporation with original Act.

3. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context, the words "Board," "Corporation," and "Council," shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the said Act. Interpretation.

15 4. It shall be lawful for the Council, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to let by way of lease all or any real and personal property vested in the Corporation by the said Act, and previously vested in the Board, for any term not exceeding sixty-six years, at such rent and upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit, and to confer upon the lessee all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities in respect of the New River Harbour, or in respect of such real and personal property, as were formerly vested in the Board, and as are now vested in the Corporation and exercisable by it, acting by and through the Council, as fully and effectually as if such powers, functions, duties, and authorities had been conferred upon such lessee by Act of the General Assembly: Provided that such letting shall be by public auction, or public tender, of which at least three months' public notice shall be given. Council may lease property by public tender.
