victed or sentenced or condemned to be punished for any capital
offence against the laws of any sovereign State;

10 And any person undergoing sentence of transportation for any
offence against such laws;

And any person who is or shall be under any conviction or
sentence or condemnation whatever in any colony or possession of such
State for any capital or transportable offence;

15 And any person not at liberty, by reason of any such conviction
or sentence or condemnation as aforesaid, to reside in any part of such
State as aforesaid, or in any colony or possession of such State in which
such conviction, sentence, or condemnation may have been had or
passed;

20 And any person so convicted or sentenced or condemned in any
such State or colony or possession as aforesaid who has or shall have
received a pardon or remission of sentence on condition that he shall
leave or not come or remain within the said State or colony or posses-
sion in which such conviction or sentence or condemnation shall have
25 been had or passed for or during any residue of the term of the original
sentence, or for or during any other period.
