A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to prohibit the Importation of Intoxicating Liquors, or the
 Manufacture of Intoxicating Liquors within the Colony of
 New Zealand. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in
 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-
 lows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Importation or Manu- s
 facture of Intoxicating Liquors Prohibition Act, 1893."

10 2. On and after the passing of this Act it shall not be lawful to Prohibition.
 import, or manufacture in the Colony of New Zealand, any intoxicating
 liquors of any kind whatsoever.

15 3. Any intoxicating liquors imported or manufactured in contra- Forfeiture and
penalty.
 vention of this Act shall be forfeited, and any person directly or
 indirectly concerned in such breach shall forfeit and pay a penalty of
 not less than *one hundred* pounds nor more than *five hundred* pounds,
 recoverable, with full costs of suit, by any person informing in respect
 thereof; in default of the fine and costs not being paid, to be impris-
 oned for not less than three months nor more than twelve months.
