WHEREAS it is expedient that the inspection and examination of Preamble. 5 public primary schools should be conducted by the Department of

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Inspectors of Schools Short Title. 10 Act, 1899," and it shall come into operation on the first day of

January, one thousand nine hundred.

2. On the date at which this Act comes into operation the Education Depart-Education Boards shall cease to conduct the inspection and seamination of the schools in their respective education districts, and the Department of Education shall thereafter conduct such Boards. inspection and examination.

3. The Governor may from time to time appoint such Inspectors Governor may of schools as may be deemed necessary, and such Inspectors shall be 20 officers of the Department of Education, and shall have the right to enter any public school at any time, and shall inspect and examine all public schools in such manner as shall be prescribed by regulation.

4. All Inspectors appointed by any Education Board, and in Present Inspectors office at the time of the coming into operation of this Act, shall be deemed appointed under the Act. 25 deemed to have been appointed by the Governor under this Act.
