1. Short Title.

2. Athenæum may erect building in accordance with approved designs.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Invercargill Public Offices Site Act, 1875. Title.

WHEREAS by section five of the Invercargill Public Offices Site Act, 1875, it was enacted, *inter alia*, that it should not be lawful  
5 for the Invercargill Athenæum to make any building or erection on the block of land situate on the west side of the land described in the Fourth Schedule thereto, and being part thereof having a frontage of twenty-one feet in the Crescent, and a depth of fifty-two feet on the west end and a depth of fifty-eight feet on the east end of the said  
10 block, but that the said block of land should be used by the Invercargill Athenæum as a yard or passage only: And whereas the said Invercargill Athenæum is desirous of erecting a building on the said land hereinbefore described, being part of the land mentioned and described in the Fourth Schedule to the Invercargill Public Offices  
15 Site Act, 1875:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Invercargill Public Offices Site  
20 Act 1875 Amendment Act, 1907. Short Title.

2. The Invercargill Athenæum may erect on the said land hereinbefore mentioned and described a building in accordance with designs and plans previously submitted to and approved of in writing by the Minister for Public Works. Athenæum may erect building in accordance with approved designs.
