## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to apply a Sum of Money out of the Public Account and Tille. other Accounts to the Service of the Year ending the Thirtyfirst Day of March, Nineteen hundred and eight.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Imprest Supply Act, 1907.

Short Title.

2. In addition to all sums otherwise granted, there may be Imprest grants. 10 issued and applied, by way of imprest, towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and eight,—

(a.) Out of the respective funds and accounts (being part of the Public Account) specified in the First Schedule hereto, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole five hundred and eighty-one thousand pounds, as set forth in that Schedule;

(b.) Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, the respective sums therein set forth, not exceeding in the whole twelve thousand pounds;

(c.) Out of the Consolidated Fund, for transfer to the Public Works Fund, any sums not exceeding one hundred thousand pounds.

3. The aforesaid sums shall be charged in the manner hereafter To be charged as 25 to be expressed in any Act or Acts passed in this present session of expressed in future Act. Parliament for appropriating the public revenues of the colony for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and eight. No. 1-1.

Railway increases continued.

4. Notwithstanding any Act to the contrary, the increases referred to in section five of the Public Revenues Acts Amendment Act, 1906, may continue to be paid out of moneys granted by this Act or any other Act passed during this session of Parliament granting moneys for the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of 5 March, nineteen hundred and eight.
