A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Justices of the Peace Short Title. Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1884."

2. In the construction of this Act the words "the said Act" Interpretation. mean "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1882."

3. In subsection two of section one hundred and eighteen of the Two Justices or 10 said Act all words after the word "before" shall be struck out, and to adjudicate on the words "two Justices or a Resident Magistrate" shall be inserted indicable offences. in lieu thereof.
