ANALYSIS.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Justices of the Peace Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1908, and shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Any information or complaint, and any affidavit of the service Informations or 10 of any summons, authorised by or required for the purposes of the complaints, how taken. principal Act may be sworn, taken, or received before or by either a Justice or the Clerk of a Court constituted under the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1908, or the deputy of such Clerk.
