A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to declare invalid certain By-laws made by Local Authorities. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Local Authorities' By-laws Act, 1893." Short Title.

2. Every by-law made by any local authority prohibiting absolutely or without leave of such authority the playing of musical instruments by any person or by any persons conjointly, and whether or not as part of any procession, in any street, road, or public place, shall be deemed invalid, and is hereby rescinded. By-laws prohibiting music in streets, &c., invalid.

Nothing herein contained shall be construed to permit the playing of musical instruments in manner so that the public traffic in any street, road, or public place shall thereby, or in consequence thereof, be stopped or impeded.
