LABOUR DEPARTMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill consolidates the Labour Department Act 1908 and its amendments, and also incorporates the Employment Act 1945.

It provides for the constitution of the Department of Labour and for its functions, including the functions now exercised by the National Employment Service, which is to be merged in the Department of Labour and will cease to exist as a separate Department.

In the Bill the existing provisions have been redrafted in a more modern form where necessary, certain new provisions have been inserted as indicated by a black line in the margin, and some obsolete provisions have been omitted.

The First Schedule sets out a list of the Acts administered by the Department of Labour.

The Second Schedule sets out amendments that are consequential on the changing of the name of the Department from "Department of Labour and Employment" to "Department of Labour", and on the abolition of the office of Director of Employment.

The sources of the clauses of the Bill are shown in the marginal notes, and the comparative table below shows where each repealed enactment appears in the Bill, or, as the case may be, the reason for its omission.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to consolidate and amend certain enactments Title. relating to the Department of Labour.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New

5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Labour Depart- Short Title and commencement. ment Act 1954.

(2) This Act shall come into force on the first day 10 of November, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires- Interpretation. "Department" means the Department of Labour 1908, No. 93, constituted under this Act:

No. 52—1

"Employer" means a person employing any worker or workers; and includes any manager or other person acting on behalf of an employer:

- "Minister" means the Minister of Labour; and 5 includes any person for the time being authorized to exercise or perform any of the powers, duties, or functions of the Minister:
- "Person" includes a corporation sole; and also includes a body of persons, whether incorpo- 10 rated or not:
- "Secretary" means the Secretary of Labour appointed for the purposes of this Act; and includes any person for the time being authorized to exercise or perform any of the 15 powers, duties, or functions of the Secretary:
- "Worker" means any person of any age of either sex employed by any employer to do any work for hire or reward.

3. There shall be a Department of State to be called 20 the Department of Labour, which, under the control of the Minister, shall be charged with the administration of this Act and of the Acts specified in the *First* Schedule to this Act and with such other functions as may be lawfully conferred on it. 25

4. (1) There shall from time to time be appointed under the Public Service Act 1912 a Secretary of Labour, who shall be the administrative head of the Department.

(2) All Inspectors, Registrars, Clerks, and other officers and employees of the Department, in the exercise 30 and performance of the powers, duties, and functions conferred or imposed on them by any of the Acts administered by the Department, shall act under the direction of the Secretary, and the Secretary may in any case exercise or perform any of the powers, duties, and 35 functions of any such officer as if he personally held the office of that officer.

5. (1) There shall from time to time be appointed under the Public Service Act 1912 such number of Assistant Secretaries of Labour as may be deemed neces-40 sary. The Assistant Secretaries shall, under the control of the Secretary, perform such general official duties as they are called upon to perform by the Secretary.

(2) On the occurrence from any cause of a vacancy in the office of Secretary (whether by reason of death, resignation, or otherwise), and in case of the absence from duty of the Secretary (from whatever cause

- 5 arising), and so long as any such vacancy or absence continues, each Assistant Secretary shall have and may exercise such of the powers, duties, and functions of the Secretary as relate to the general official duties that he has been called upon to perform.
- (3) The fact that an Assistant Secretary exercises or 10 performs any power, duty, or function of the Secretary shall be conclusive evidence of his authority to do so.

(4) For the purposes of this section the powers, duties, and functions of the Secretary shall be deemed to

15 include such of the powers of the Minister as the Secretary may for the time being be authorized to exercise pursuant to a delegation under section seven of this Act.

6. There may from time to time be appointed under Other officers. the Public Service Act 1912 such other officers and 1936, No. 4, s. 4 20 employees of the Department as may be deemed necessary.

7. (1) The Minister may from time to time, by Delegation of writing under his hand, delegate to the Secretary all or Minister's any of the powers exercisable by him under this Act powers. powers. 25 or under any other Act.

(2) Every delegation under this section shall be revocable at will, and no such delegation shall prevent the exercise of any power by the Minister.

(3) Any such delegation may be made subject to 30 such restrictions and conditions as the Minister thinks fit, and may be made either generally or in relation to any particular case.

(4) Every such delegation shall, unless and until revoked, continue in force according to its tenor. In the

- 35 event of the Minister by whom any such delegation has been made ceasing to hold office, it shall continue to have effect as if made by the person for the time being holding office as Minister, and, in the event of the Secretary to whom any such delegation has been made ceasing to hold
- 40 office, it shall continue to have effect as if made to the person for the time being holding office as Secretary, or,

if there is no Secretary in office, to the person for the time being authorized under section *five* of this Act or otherwise to exercise the powers of the Secretary.

(5) The fact that the Secretary or any person acting for the Secretary exercises any power of the Minister 5 shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be sufficient evidence that he has been authorized to do so by a delegation under this section.

8. The general functions of the Department shall be to promote and maintain full employment, safe and 10 healthy working conditions, good relationships between employers and workers, and the proper fulfilment by employers, workers, and other persons of obligations placed upon them by awards and industrial agreements and by the Acts, regulations, and orders administered by 15 the Department.

9. The general duties of the Department shall be—

- (a) To provide a complete employment service for the purpose of placing workers in employment,
 - assisting employers to provide employment, 20 assisting persons in all sections of the community to find better or more suitable employment (whether in professional technical, supervisory, or any other capacities), and assisting persons who require occupational 25 readjustment or training or other assistance to enable them to continue or resume full time employment:
- (b) To make inspections and to take any other necessary action for the purpose of ensuring 30 that there is fulfilment of the obligations placed upon any employer, worker, or other person under any award or industrial agreement, or under any of the Acts, regulations, and orders administered by the Department: 35
- (c) To maintain such registers of shops, offices, factories, and places of work generally as may be deemed necessary for the fulfilment of the Department's functions:
- (d) To collect and publish information relating to 40 employment and unemployment, and wages, and such other matters relevant to the functions of the Department as the Minister may from time to time require:

- (e) To make surveys and forecasts of the classes of employment from time to time required or available or likely to be required or available, and to do all things deemed necessary or expedient for the purpose of placing suitable and qualified persons in such employment on a voluntary basis:
- (f) Generally to do all things deemed necessary or expedient for the purpose of promoting and maintaining full employment, whether by facilitating the better location or availability of employment in relation to the labour available or otherwise howsoever.
- 10. (1) The Department may exercise all such Powers of 15 powers as are reasonably necessary for the effective performance of the Department's functions and duties.

(2) Without limiting the general provisions of subsection one of this section, it is hereby declared that the Department may---

- (a) Establish, maintain, and operate hostels and 20 other residential or boarding establishments for workers:
 - (b) Provide a home aid service, by making the services of workers employed in the Department available for domestic and other work in cases of emergency and in other special circumstances:
 - (c) Make such arrangements for the selection, transport, and accommodation of immigrants as the Minister may from time to time require:
 - (d) Make such charges as may be fixed by the Minister for any services or accommodation provided for any person by the Department:
 - Provided that no charge shall be made for any services provided under paragraph (a)of section nine of this Act.

11. (1) For the purpose of assisting in the adminis- Advisory tration of this Act the Minister may from time to time Councils and 40 appoint such number of Advisory Councils and Advisory Committees. Committees as he thinks fit.

(3) Every Advisory Council or Advisory Committee appointed under this section shall have such functions in relation to this Act as the Minister may from time to time determine.

(4) There may be paid out of money appropriated 5 by Parliament for the purpose to the members of any Advisory Council or Advisory Committee appointed under this section remuneration by way of fees, salary, or allowances and travelling allowances and expenses in accordance with the Fees and Travelling Allowances Act 10 1951, and the provisions of that Act shall apply accordingly as if any such Council or Committee were a statutory Board within the meaning of that Act.

12. (1) The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, make all such regulations as 15 in his opinion are necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to this Act.

(2) Without limiting the general power conferred by subsection *one* of this section, it is hereby declared that regulations may be made under this section for all or any 20 of the following purposes:

- (a) Obtaining any information or particulars that may be required for the purposes of this Act, whether in relation to labour requirements or retrenchments, movements of labour, subsidies, 25 or otherwise:
- (b) Prescribing penalties for offences against the regulations, not exceeding the penalties prescribed by section fourteen of this Act.

(3) All regulations made under this section shall be 30 laid before Parliament within twenty-eight days after the date of the making thereof if Parliament is then in session, and, if not, shall be laid before Parliament within twentyeight days after the date of the commencement of the next ensuing session. 35

13. (1) No information obtained by the Minister or by any officer or employee of the Department under any of the powers conferred by this Act or by any regulations made under this Act shall be communicated to any person or made use of except for the purposes of this Act. 40
