A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Mines Act, 1877," in order Title. to grant to Gold-mining Claims or Leases Right of Protection, with Suspension of Working Operations, under certain conditions.

WHEREAS it has been proved by experience that it is at times Preamble. needful to the welfare of the gold-mining industry to suspend work in gold-mining claims, and leases of land held for gold-mining purposes, for a period longer than that allowed by "The Mines Act, 1877," or by the conditions of the deeds of lease:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Mines Act 1877 Amend- short Title. 10 ment Act, 1879," and this Act shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

2. This Act shall be read and construed as incorporated with and Act incorporated with "Mines Act, art of "The Mines Act, 1877." as part of "The Mines Act, 1877.'

mining purposes, who shall prove to the Minister administering the Mines to have spent not less than one thousand five hundred pounds cash by labour, or by labour and machinery, therewith connected, in prospecting and developing such property within the three years preceding the application for protection hereafter mentioned, or shall 5 prove as aforesaid to have spent not less than six hundred pounds cash by labour or by labour and machinery in prospecting and developing such property without deriving any direct benefit from such claim or land within the twelve months preceding the application, shall be entitled to have such claim or lease registered for protection for twelve 10 months, upon application to the Minister administering the Mines, supported by a detailed statement of the expenditure, and an affidavit, made before a Justice of the Peace, swearing such statement to be Upon verification of the correctness of the application and correct. of the documents thereto attached, the Minister administering the 15 Mines shall, on prepayment by the applicant to the Colonial Treasury of the sum of five pounds, cause a certificate of protection for the twelve months to be issued in favour of the applicant, according to the form in the Schedule to this Act, and shall cause all such certificates of protection to be immediately published in two consecutive numbers 20 of the Government Gazette, and in at least one newspaper published in the district, and an abstract of such certificates affixed in the office of the Warden of the gold field district where the property is situate.

4. At the expiration of the period of protection, work shall be resumed in the claim or leased land in accordance with the provisions 25 of "The Mines Act, 1877," and with the conditions of the deed under which the land is held for gold-mining purposes.

5. After a lapse of twelve months from the last day of the protection, any holder of a gold-mining claim or lease, who shall prove, in the form above provided, to the Minister administering the Mines to 30 have spent a further sum of *five hundred* pounds cash within such twelve months in labour, or in labour and machinery, for prospecting and developing such claim or leasehold, without deriving any direct benefit from such claim or leasehold, shall be entitled to another grant of protection for twelve months, and so on every alternate twelve 35 months, upon proof being adduced of *five hundred* pounds cash having been spent within the preceding twelve months in prospecting the claim or leasehold without deriving any direct benefit from the claim or leasehold.

6. The Minister administering the Mines shall have the power of 40 granting protection for eighteen consecutive months if, in his judgment, reasonable and sufficient grounds are shown in the application; and shall also have the power of granting six months' protection to any claim- or leaseholder, whether the amount specified has been spent in developing and prospecting it or not, provided sufficient reasons in 45 its favour are adduced to his satisfaction.

7. Any holder of a gold-mining claim or gold-mining lease who shall prove to the Minister administering the Mines in the manner above described to have spent the sum of six thousand pounds cash over and above all profits derived from such claim or leasehold, shall 50 be entitled to a certificate of protection for three years, and for every certificate of protection the sum of five pounds shall be prepaid into the Colonial Treasury, the Government undertaking to pay the cost of publishing the certificates in the Government Gazette.

8. The protection shall date from the day of application. 9. The certificate of protection shall entitle the holder of the gold-mining claim or lease to suspend all working operations during the period of protection, notwithstanding all conditions or provisions to the contrary imposed by "The Mines Act, 1877," or by deeds of

10. This Act shall in no way affect the validity of the deeds of Act not to affect lease of land for gold-mining granted up to the time of coming into validity of deeds of lease of land for gold-mining heretofore thereto attached, but simply establish a right to obtain protection
