A BILL INTITULED

AN Act to extend the Operations of the Meat-export Control Acts, 1921-22 and 1924. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Meat-export Control Amendment Act, 1934, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat-export Control Act, 1921-22. Short Title.
2. In the case of any owner, company, firm, or person owning freezing-works in New Zealand at the date of the passing of this Act, and while such works are kept open for killing operations, then and in any such case such company, firm, or person owning such works shall undertake to receive, kill, and handle all stock offering on owners' account for the charges, allowances, and conditions approved of from time to time by the New Zealand Meat Producers' Board after reasonable written notice addressed to the person in charge of any such freezing-works, such notice to be given and accepted in such manner and at such time as the said Board may from time to time determine by written directions made generally or specially in such case as the said Board may decide. Work to be carried on on owner's account if companies disregard law.
