## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to vest Native Reserves in the Public Trustee. Title.

**B**E IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Native Reserves Vesting Act, 1879." Short Title.

2. Upon a day to be fixed by the Governor, by Proclamation duly gazetted, all the powers and authorities which, by "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," or any Acts amending the same, may be exercised by the Governor, shall vest in and may be exercised by the Public Trustee. Powers of the Governor under "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," vested in Public Trustee.

But the Public Trustee shall have no authority to delegate all or any of the powers vested in him under or by virtue of this Act.

3. All lands, moneys, real and personal estate vested in the Governor, or held by him under the said Acts or any of them, shall, upon the day to be fixed as aforesaid, vest in the Public Trustee, subject to the fulfilment of any lawful contracts or obligations in respect thereof which may have been entered into by the Governor or any delegate appointed by him under any of such Acts. Lands, &c., vested in Governor to vest in the Public Trustee.
