A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Noxious Weeds Act, 1900.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Noxious Weeds Act Amendment Act, 1907, and it shall form part of and be read together with the Noxious Weeds Act, 1900 (hereinafter called the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. Sections three and eighteen of the principal Act are hereby repealed.

Repeals.

3. Every local authority other than the Minister shall, out of its general revenues, from time to time clear, as required by section nine of the principal Act, all lands and roads under its control; and if it fails or neglects so to do the Minister may cause the same to be done at its expense:

Local authority to clear lands and roads under its control.

Provided that when any noxious weed may reasonably be presumed to have spread from any fence or property having a frontage to any such road the local authority may call upon the occupier to clear the road opposite to such fence or property, and, failing his so doing, may execute the work and recover the cost thereof from him.

4. All regulations under the principal Act are hereby modified in so far as they are in conflict with this Act.
