## A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to provide for the Licensing of Pedlars and Hawkers.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-5 lows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Pedlars and Hawkers Short Title. Act, 1901," and it shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and two.

2. In the interpretation hereof the following words and expres- Interpretation. 10 sions shall respectively have the meanings herein assigned to

them:

"Pedlars and hawkers" shall mean every person who travels through the country, either with or without goods or samples of goods, whether representing a wholesale or retail business, and soliciting orders from private individuals or from those not engaged in the trade, and shall also mean and include any person who vends any goods or chattels from any building held under any tenancy of not

less than six months' duration:

"Commercial traveller" shall mean every person who travels through the country, either with or without goods or samples of goods, as the representative of a wholesale house, and soliciting orders from those engaged in trade

"Wholesale house" shall mean a house or firm that disposes of their goods only to those engaged in trade:

"Engaged in trade" shall mean every person engaged in the manufacture of any goods for sale, or in carrying on the

business of storekeeper for the sale of goods:

"Conveyance" shall mean any vehicle, vessel, or other contrivance of any sort whatsoever, which may be used for the carriage of goods either by land or water:

"Local authority" shall mean the Council or Board of any

borough, or town, or county:

"Magistrate" shall mean any Stipendiary Magistrate appointed under "The Magistrates Courts Act, 1893."

3. Every person who carries on business by the sale of goods hawked or carried about in any manner for sale shall be deemed to be a pedlar and hawker under this Act.

4. From and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and two, it shall not be lawful for any person in any way to 15 carry on the business of pedlar and hawker, or commercial traveller, except pursuant to the authority of a license issued to him under this Act, and within the district for which license is issued.

5. Licenses under this Act shall be of one class, called "local license," and shall be issued to British subjects only who shall have 20 resided in New Zealand not less than twelve months prior to the date on which the application is lodged with the local authority.

6. Every applicant for a license under this Act must lodge with the Clerk of the local authority a certificate of character signed by four ratepayers as set forth in *First* Schedule hereto.

7. The license shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and shall bear the seal of the local authority, and be signed by the Clerk and the Chairman.

8. The fees payable for a license under this Act shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule to this Act, and shall be paid to 30 the local authority issuing the license.

9. If the local authority is satisfied that the applicant is a qualified person and of good character, and also that the application has been duly lodged, it may grant the license on payment of the prescribed fee.

10. Every license shall be in force from the first day of January 35 in each year to the thirty-first day of December in the same year, and shall be renewed on payment of the original fees by the Clerk of the local authority which issued the original license; such renewal to be indorsed on the license.

11. Any constable may, without warrant, seize and detain any 40 person not being a licensee under this Act who is found carrying on the business of hawker or commercial traveller, and detain him till the following day for the purpose of proceeding against him for such offence, unless the same can be sooner disposed of.

12. Every person found guilty of a breach of this Act shall be 45 liable to a penalty of a sum not exceeding two pounds for a first offence, and for every subsequent offence not less than five pounds.

13. All fines and penalties under this Act shall be paid to the local authority of the district wherein the offence is committed.

14. If fermented or spirituous liquor is at any time being hawked 50 or carried about by any one holding a license under this Act, such

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

# SECOND SCHEDULE.

THE fees payable under this Act shall, in the case of Town Boards or Boroughs, be: For a pedlar and hawker travelling on foot, £1; if using horse or conveyance, £2; and, in the case of Counties, if travelling on foot, £2; if using a horse or conveyance, £4; and in the case of commercial travellers, 10s. per annum.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.
