An Act to amend the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1911, and shall form part of and be read together with the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

10 2. (1.) The Governor may from time to time by Order in Extended use of Council gazetted make regulations prescribing the documents on which an impression indicating a stamp-value of any prescribed denomination may be made by the recording-machines mentioned in section sixteen of the principal Act, and the conditions under which 15 such impressions may be made.

(2.) The provisions of the said section sixteen shall extend and apply to all documents prescribed in any such regulation.
