POST AND TELEGRAPH AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1930, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. Section two hundred and thirty-six of the principal Act is hereby amended by striking out the words "to hold office during his pleasure" in paragraph (a) of subsection two thereof, and substituting the words "one being a person approved in the prescribed manner by the officers of the Department and to be Chairman of the Board, and both to hold office for respective terms not in either case exceeding three years".

Section 236 of principal Act amended.
