2. Section 16 of the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, amended. Extended right of appeal.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Department Amendment Act, 1919, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918. Short Title.

2. Subsection one of section sixteen of the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, is hereby repealed, and the following provisions are substituted therefor:— Section 16 of the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, amended.

“(1.) Every officer of the Department shall have the right of appeal to the Post and Telegraph Appeal Board against— Extended right of appeal.

“(a.) Any determination of his superior officers relative to his classification, grade, salary, allowances, or promotion, including any determination relating to the grading or relative rate of progress of such officer in any classification list prepared pursuant to this Act or any regulations thereunder; and for the purposes of this subsection any appointment made by the Public Service Commissioner under any of the provisions of section fourteen of this Act shall be deemed to be a determination of a superior officer relative to the classification, salary, or allowance of any officer considering himself entitled to such appointment:—

“(b.) Any fine, reduction of salary, deprivation of privileges, reduction in grade or class, or dismissal, whether upon an inquiry held pursuant to this Act or any regulations thereunder or otherwise.”
