A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post and Telegraph Title. Department.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Post and Telegraph Short Title.

Department Act, 1894."

2. The Post and Telegraph Departments of the public service Post and Telegraph are hereby declared to be combined into one department, called the Department. "Post and Telegraph Department," which shall be administered by 10 the Minister holding the offices of Postmaster-General and Commissioner of Telegraphs (hereinafter called "the Minister").

3. The Governor may, from time to time, appoint such persons appointment of the Post and Secretary and as he shall think fit to be respectively the Secretary of the Post and Superintendent. Telegraph Department, and the Superintendent of Electric Lines.

4. The Secretary shall, under the direction of the Minister, have Duties of Secretary. the control of the Post and Telegraph Department, save in so far as the Superintendent of Electric Lines (hereinafter called "the Superintendent") has the administration of "The Electric Lines Act, 1884" (which is to be read with this Act); and the Governor may, 20 from time to time, define the respective functions of the Secretary

and the Superintendent. 5. (1.) The Secretary, the Superintendent, and one other person Board of Appeal. (to be elected from among their number by the officers of the Post

and Telegraph Department) are hereby constituted a Board of 25 Appeal, to which all appeals in relation to any question of classification, status, or salary arising under "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," or any amendment thereof, shall be referred.

(2.) The Board shall inquire into every such appeal, with power Powers thereof. 30 to summon and examine witnesses (upon oath if need be), and to call for the production of papers and documents; and shall make report No. 175—1.

thereon to the Minister, whose decision shall be final: Provided that, save with the consent of the Minister, no appeal shall lie in respect of any matter already disposed of by any Board heretofore existing.

6. The First and Second Schedules of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act, 1890," and section four of "The Post and Telegraph Classification and Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1891," are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following is enacted, that is to say:—
