A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to impose a Property-tax and to amend "The Property Title. Assessment Act, 1885."

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,-We, Your Majesty's Most Address. 5 dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, towards raising the necessary supplies to defray Your Majesty's public expenses, and making an addition to the public revenue, have freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto Your Majesty the duties hereinafter men-

10 tioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Property-tax Act, 1888." Short Title. 152. For the twelve months commencing on the first day of April, Rate of propertyone thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, there shall be charged, tax. levied, collected, and paid for the use of Her Majesty the several duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,-

- For and in respect of all property: for every 20twenty shillings of the value thereof, the duty of One penny. For and in respect of all fire, marine, accident, fidelity, live-stock, plate-glass,
 - or guarantee policies issued by any insurance company: for every one hundred pounds of premiums received, the duty of

.... Thirty shillings. But the duty lastly hereby made payable shall be calculated

30 upon the premiums received by each such company in the twelve months prior to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-eight, in respect of policies issued by such company.

And such respective duties shall be paid on such day or days, and either in one sum or by instalments of equal or varying amount, as the Governor in Council may from time to time direct.

3. The duties hereby charged shall be levied, collected, and paid under or by virtue of "The Property Assessment Act, 1885," and the Act amending the same, which Acts shall be read and construed with this Act.

4. The statements required to be made by persons under "The 10 Property Assessment Act, 1885," for the triennial period commencing on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, are hereby required to be furnished at any time in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, upon public notice being given by the Commissioner as prescribed in the said Act; and all the provisions of the said Act as amended hereby shall extend and apply to every such statement and the assessment made thereon as if the same had respectively been made within the triennial period to which it relates, and any tax to be assessed upon or in respect of any such statement or assessment may be charged, levied, and collected accord- 20 ingly.
