A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to give additional facility for trying the
Legality of Bills passed by Provincial Councils. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 **1.** The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Provincial Councils
Legislation Appeal Amendment Act, 1873.” Short Title.

10 **2.** Clause three of “The Provincial Councils Legislation Appeal
Act, 1869,” shall be read with the addition of the words, “or any
two or more members of the Provincial Council,” after the word
“Superintendent,” in both places where the word Superintendent
occurs; also with the addition of the words, “or invalidity,” after the
word “validity.” Governor may, on
request of members
of Provincial Council,
take opinion of
Supreme Court as to
validity of any Bill
passed by Provincial
Council.

Clause four shall be read with the addition of the words, “or
members of the Provincial Council,” after the word “Superintendent.”
