A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to admit Women to the General Assembly of New Zealand. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Parliamentary Dis- Short Title.

2. In "The Legislative Council Act, 1891," the words "per- Interpretation.

deemed to include "women" and "woman" respectively.

3. The last paragraph of section nine of "The Electoral Act, Section 9 of Elec-
toral Act amended.
1893," beginning with the words "No woman," is hereby repealed.

4. The said section nine, and sections three and seventy-five, Sections 9, 3, and
75, and Schedule
XI. amended.
15 and the Eleventh Schedule, of "The Electoral Act, 1893," shall be
read and construed as if the word "person" were substituted for the
word "man" throughout the said sections and Schedule.

5. Section one hundred and fifty-one of "The Electoral Act, Section 151
amended.
20 1893," is hereby amended by the omission of the word "male" from
the second paragraph of the said section.
