A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to create an Education Board within the Patea Title. District, Province of Taranaki.

WHEREAS by an Act intituled "The Taranaki Education Reserves Preamble. Act, 1871," the Governor is authorized to grant certain lands in the Patea District, described in the First Schedule hereto, to the Education Board of the Province: And whereas it is desirable that 5 the said lands be granted and held in trust by a local Board:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Patea Education Short Title. 10 Board Act, 1873."

2. The district the boundaries whereof are described in the District described Second Schedule hereto shall be the district within which this Act in Schedule may be altered by shall come into operation; and it shall be lawful for the Superin- Superintendent. tendent, when requested to do so by the Local Board, from time to 15 time to vary or after the said boundaries by notice in the Provincial

On some day in the month of December after the passing of Meeting of housethis Act, and at a time and place to be fixed by the Superintendent, by notice in some newspaper having circulation within the district, a 20 meeting shall be held of all persons of full age, being householders within such district.

4. At such meeting the persons present shall first elect a chair- Meeting shall elect man, and then elect six persons, being residents within such district, Trusteen to be Educational Trustees, to be called the Board of Education 25 Trustees.

5. In the event of more than six candidates being proposed, the chairman shall take a show of hands, and the six candidates having the greatest show of hands shall be declared to be elected.

6. If any dispute arise as to the number of votes recorded for each candidate, the chairman shall poll the electors present; and the 5 result of such poll, when certified by the chairman, shall be final and conclusive.

7. The two candidates having the highest number of votes shall hold office for three years, the next two highest for two years, and the two lowest for one year.

8. In the month of December in every year, at a time and place to be fixed by the Superintendent by notice as aforesaid, a meeting of householders shall be held to elect two persons, being electors and resident in the district, in the place of the retiring Trustees, who shall be eligible for re-election. At such meeting the Chairman of the 15 Board of Trustees shall preside, who shall conduct the election as provided in sections five and six of this Act; the persons so elected shall hold office for three years.

Nature of trust and powers of Board.

9. In the event of any Trustee dying or resigning office, it shall be lawful for the Board to appoint a person in his place, who shall 20 hold the office of Trustee so long as the person vacating the office would have been entitled to hold it.

10. The Board of Trustees so elected shall hold the lands described in the First Schedule hereto, or any other lands which may be hereafter granted to them in trust for educational purposes, any-25 thing in "The Taranaki Education Reserves Act, 1871," to the contrary notwithstanding.

11. The Board shall hold the said lands in trust for the same purposes, and shall exercise the same powers with respect to them as stated in sections five and six of "The Taranaki Education Reserves 30 Act, 1871."
