BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

All fines and penalties which may be recovered by virtue of the Police Reward Fund said Act, and all proceeds or part proceeds of any forfeiture, penalty, to be applied as rewards for services. or seizure made under the said Act or any other Act for the time being in force, and to which any constable belonging to the Police Force shall be entitled, shall be paid into the Public Trust Office, to 15 be placed to a separate fund to be called "The Police Reward Fund;" and the Governor may from time to time award, out of the said Fund, to any of the officers or constables belonging to the police force such sum of money as to him shall seem meet, as a reward for extraordinary diligence or exertion, or for special services, or for

20 special courage or bravery exhibited in the performance of their duty.
