A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Public Health Act, 1876."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 **1.** The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Health Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1884." Short Title.

10 **2.** Every Local Board of Health constituted under "The Public Health Act, 1876," shall have and may exercise the powers in restraint of offensive trades given by sections seventy-six to seventy-nine, both inclusive, of the said Act, as well as the Local Board of a city or borough, as in the aforesaid sections mentioned. Further powers in restraint of offensive trades.

15 **3.** No Local Board shall consent to the establishment by any person of the trade of blood-boiler in premises situate within half a mile distance from any premises occupied as a dwelling-house, or as a shop, store, or factory of any kind wherein persons are employed during any hours of the day. Blood-boiling establishments prohibited within half a mile of inhabited houses.

20 **4.** Every Local Board of Health having jurisdiction outside the limits of a borough shall have, and may exercise, the power of making by-laws regulating the construction of buildings which is given to Borough Councils under section three hundred and forty-nine of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and the fifth subsection thereof; and for this purpose the aforesaid section and subsection shall be read *mutatis mutandis*, and shall apply accordingly. Local Boards may make by-laws for building regulations.
