A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Public Health Act, 1876."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Health Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1898." Short Title.

10 2. It shall be lawful for any Road Board to appoint places as depots or receptacles for the disposal of nightsoil within the district of such Road Board. Road Boards may establish depots.

15 3. No private person shall within the district of any Road Board establish any such depot or receptacle for the purpose aforesaid, or allow premises or land in his possession or occupation within such district to be used for any such purpose, except with the previous consent in writing of such Road Board: No private person shall establish depots without the consent of the Road Board.

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall be construed to prevent any person disposing on his property of nightsoil not conveyed thereto from outside the limits of such property.

20 4. Any person contravening any of the provisions of the *last-preceding* section of this Act shall be deemed to have caused the existence of a nuisance calling for abatement under the provisions of Part II. of "The Public Health Act, 1876," and those provisions shall apply accordingly. Proceedings.
