A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Public Health Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Health Amendment Short Title. Act, 1910, and shall form part of and be read together with the Public Health Act, 1908.

2. By-laws made under section one hundred and eight of the Additional power 10 Public Health Act, 1908, may prescribe the minimum frontage and as to by-laws. area of land on which a dwellinghouse may be erected in the district or any specified part thereof:

Provided that such area shall not be less than one-fifth of an acre in any district or specified part in which a sewerage system does 15 not exist.

3. In districts in which no sewerage-works exist, the local Annual fee for authority, in lieu of raising a separate rate as mentioned in section refuse, &c. sixty of the principal Act, may levy an annual fee on the occupier of every property on which a dwellinghouse is erected in the dis-20 trict, or any defined part thereof.

4. (1.) The Governor may from time to time, whenever in his Vaccination opinion it is necessary, by Order in Council declare any defined part of New Zealand to be a "vaccination area" within which Part IV of the principal Act (except section one hundred and eighty-two) 25 shall have effect.

- (2.) Every such Order in Council shall have effect within the vaccination area therein defined until revoked by a subsequent Order in Council.
- (3.) On such revocation the said area shall cease to be a vaccina-30 tion area.
 - (4.) Except within a vaccination area no proceedings shall be instituted for the recovery of any penalty under sections one hundred and seventy to one hundred and seventy-three of the principal Act.
