A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Public Holidays Act, 1910.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
5 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays Amendment
Act, 1921, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the
Public Holidays Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as the principal
Act).

Short Title.

10 2. (1.) Where in any Act or in any award or industrial agree-
ment reference is made to the day after Christmas Day (commonly
known as Boxing Day), such reference shall, when Christmas Day
falls on a Sunday hereafter, be deemed to be a reference both to
the next succeeding Monday and to the next succeeding Tuesday.

When Christmas

to Boxing Day to be

15 (2.) Section two of the principal Act is hereby amended by
repealing paragraph (d), and substituting the following paragraph:—

“(d.) To New Year’s Day, such reference shall, when New
Year’s Day falls on a Sunday, hereafter be deemed to
be to the next succeeding Monday.”
