A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Parliamentary Honorarium and Privileges Title. Act, 1884."

WHEREAS it is expedient that the sum payable to members of the Preamble. 5 General Assembly for their expenses in relation to their attendance at Parliament should be altered:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Parliamentary Hono-Short Title. 10 rarium and Privileges Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1887."

2. From and after the coming into operation of this Act clause Repeal. three of "The Parliamentary Honorarium and Privileges Act, 1884," shall be repealed.

3. From and after the coming into operation of this Act, and Allowances to 15 subject to the provisions of "The Parliamentary Honorarium and Parliament." Privileges Act, 1884," there shall be paid out of the Consolidated Fund to every member of the House of Representatives residing at a distance exceeding three miles in a direct line from the building

20 wherein the General Assembly is summoned to meet an allowance of one hundred and fifty pounds for every session at which he attends, and to every member of the House of Representatives residing within three miles in a direct line of the place of meeting as aforesaid one hundred pounds for every session at which he attends; and to every

25 member of the Legislative Council residing at a distance exceeding three miles in a direct line from the place of meeting as aforesaid one hundred pounds for every session at which he attends, and to every member of the Legislative Council residing within three miles in a direct line of the place of meeting as aforesaid sixty-seven pounds for

30 every session at which he attends.

4. This Act shall come into operation one month after the termi- Commoncoment mination of the present session of the General Assembly.
