A BILL INTITULED

An Act to make provision for the carrying out of scientific surveys to determine the effects of proposed motorway construction and other works on Porirua Harbour

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. **Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Porirua Harbour Survey Act 1972.

10 2. **Interpretation**—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Harbour works” includes any reclamation of land from the sea and the erection of any bridge, viaduct, break-water or embankment on, over, or in the near vicinity of the harbour:

15 “Proposed harbour works” means any harbour work in relation to which tenders have been accepted or for which tenders have been or shall be called:

“The Harbour” means Porirua Harbour, the limits of which are defined by Order in Council dated the 24th day of March 1969 or by any Order in Council made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. Minister to arrange for scientific surveys—Within 1 5
month from the coming into force of this Act the Minister
of Marine and the Minister of Scientific and Industrial
Research shall arrange for the carrying out of a hydrological
and hydrographic survey of the waters of the harbour and a 10
survey of all aspects of the ecology of the harbour and its en-
virons in order that the fullest possible information may be
obtained as to the effects on the harbour of all proposed
harbour works.

4. Prohibition on harbour works—Until such times as all 15
the surveys referred to in section 3 of this Act have been
carried out and full reports thereof placed before Parliament
no harbour works or works preparatory to them shall be
carried out on, over, or in the near vicinity of the harbour.
