## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Law relating to Property.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Property Law Amendment Act, Short Title. 1930, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Property

- (2) This section shall be read subject to the provisions of the Married Women's Property Act, 1908, and of the Land Transfer Act, 1915.
- (3) Section seventeen of the Real Property Limitation Act, 1833, shall cease to have operation in New Zealand on the commencement of this section.

(4) This section shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-three.
