PALMERSTON NORTH ABATTOIR.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to confer on the Palmerston North Borough Council certain Additional Powers and Authorities in connection with the Palmerston North Abattoir. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Palmerston North Abattoir Act, 1919. Short Title.

10 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the second proviso to section twenty-seven of the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908, the Palmerston North Borough Council (hereinafter called the Council) is hereby authorized to include in the annual cost of the abattoir acquired or established by it, in lieu of the five per centum per annum mentioned in the said proviso on the capital expended in establishing and erecting the abattoir, a sum of seven pounds per centum per annum on the value of all buildings now erected or hereafter to be erected on the lands used or connected with such abattoir and the boiling-down works carried on in connection therewith, and a further sum of ten pounds per centum per annum on the value of all machinery now or at any time used in the said abattoir and boiling-down works. Annual cost of abattoir.

15 3. The Council may apply from time to time all past and future profits derived from the said boiling-down works for the purpose of additions, extensions, and renewals to the buildings, machinery, and plant of the said abattoir and boiling-down works, and shall be under no obligation to apply such profits or any part thereof towards the annual cost of the said abattoir. Application of profits.

20 4. This Act shall not be deemed to authorize the Council to conduct any of its operations so as to constitute a nuisance. Operations not to constitute a nuisance.
