This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

Title. 1. Short Title. 2. Racecourse to vest in the Crown. Schedule.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to enable the Palmerston North Borough Council to vest Title. certain Land in His Majesty as a Site for a Dairying School.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Palmerston North Short Title.

Dairying School Act, 1906."

2. The piece of land described in the Schedule hereto, and now Racecourse to vest 10 vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of in the Crown. Palmerston North (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), is hereby, with the consent of the Corporation, vested in His Majesty to be used for the erection thereon and maintenance of a dairying school or Government experimental dairying station, but for no other 15 purpose whatever:

Provided that if at the expiration of one year from the passing of this Act the Government has not erected, equipped, and opened a dairying school or a Government experimental station on the said land, or if at any time thereafter the Government, having 20 commenced to use and maintain the said land as aforesaid, shall cease to use or maintain the same and the buildings thereon for the purposes aforesaid, then and in either of such cases the said land shall immediately thereafter by force of this Act, and without any transfer or conveyance, revest in the Corporation for the estate, uses,

25 and purposes as before the land became vested as aforesaid in His Majesty.

All that parcel of land, being part of Section 1536, Borough Reserve No. 1, on the plan of the Borough of Palmerston North, containing 45 acres 1 rood 14·4 perches, bounded as follows: Starting at the extreme south-western corner of Park Road: thence along the south-eastern boundary of Park Road for a distance of 2585·5 links: thence by a line at right angles to Park Road, running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 1094·8 links: thence by a line running as follows—175 links, and bearing 229° 58′ 30″; 939·2 links, and bearing 214° 16′ 45″; 725·7 links, and bearing 201° 3′ 8″; and 1115·5 links, and bearing 213° 2′ 40″: thence by a line bearing 329° 44′ 8″, and a distance of 562·1 links: and by a line bearing 329° 46′ 30″, and 1920·8 links, to the starting-point.
