A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable the Palmerston North Borough Council to erect a Title. Building for a Library, and to include therein Shops and Offices.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. This Act may be cited as the Palmerston North Library Short Title. Empowering Act, 1927.

2. The Palmerston North Borough Council (hereinafter called "the 10 Council") is hereby empowered and authorized—

(a) To erect, construct, and maintain upon section six hundred and seventy-one, Palmerston North (being all the land included in certificate of title, volume three hundred and thirteen, folio one hundred and forty-eight, Wellington Registry) a building 15 or buildings to be used as a library and also containing such

shops and offices as the Council shall think fit.

(b) To utilize the said shops and offices or any of them for such purposes as the Council shall from time to time think fit. Struck out

(c) In addition to all other letting and leasing powers exercisable by 20 it, to let or lease the said shops and offices or any of them at such rentals and for such periods and otherwise upon such terms and conditions as the Council shall from time to time by ordinary resolution determine. 25

(cc) To let or lease in the manner prescribed by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the said shops and offices or any of $_{
m them.}$

(d) To raise a special loan under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, for such an amount as the Council shall think fit and to expend the money so raised in the erection and construction of such building or buildings.

Council may erect building for library purposes, also shops and offices, and raise special loan.
