A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Protection of Short Title.
- 5 Animals Act Amendment Act, 1874;" and it shall be read with and as part of "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," (hereinafter called "the said Act").
2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act, it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province from time to time, by Superintendent of a province may withdraw districts from operation of "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873."
- 10 Proclamation published in the *Gazette* of the province, to declare that districts to be defined in such Proclamation shall be withdrawn from the operation of the said Act and in which game or native game, for the time being subject to the provisions of the said Act, may be shot hunted taken or killed.
- 15 The boundaries of every such district shall be defined in the Proclamation declaring the same; and any such Proclamation may be in like manner altered varied or re-defined, and may prescribe a day or time when such Proclamation shall come into operation, and when it shall cease to be in operation, or such Proclamation may be made On coming into operation of Proclamation, districts to cease to be under Act.
- 20 generally, and without prescribing any or either of such days or times.
3. From and after the day fixed for the coming into operation of any such Proclamation as aforesaid, the district therein defined shall be deemed to be wholly withdrawn from the operation of the said Act.
