A BILL INTITULED

An Act to make Provision for the Appointment and Powers of Title. certain Public Officers.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Officers' Appoint- Short Title.

ment and Powers Act, 1904."

2. (1.) The Governor may from time to time, by Order in Appointment of Valuer-General. Valuer-General. 10 Council gazetted, appoint some fit person to be Valuer-General, and also some fit person to be Deputy of the Valuer-General, under "The Government Valuation of Land Act, 1896."

(2.) Such Deputy shall, under the control of the Valuer-General, perform such general official duties as he is called upon to perform by 15 the Valuer-General; and, in case of the illness, absence, or other temporary incapacity of the Valuer-General, such Deputy shall act in his name and on his behalf, and while so acting shall have and may exercise all the powers, duties, and functions of the Valuer-General.

(3.) Paragraph two of section two of that Act is hereby amended 20 by repealing the words "who shall be the Commissioner of Taxes

for the time being."

3. (1.) The members of the Board of Appeal constituted under Postal Board of "The Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1894" (other than the Appeal. elective members thereof), shall be such fit persons as the Governor, 25 from time to time by warrant under his hand, appoints.

(2.) Subsection two of section five of the last-mentioned Act is

hereby modified accordingly.

4. On the occurrence from any cause of a vacancy in any of the General powers of offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto (whether by reason of the Deputies on occurrence of 30 death or resignation of the officer holding the office or otherwise), vacancy. and so long as such vacancy continues, the Deputy for the time being of such officer shall have and may exercise all the powers, duties, and functions of the officer of whom he was Deputy.
