POLICE OFFENCES AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Under paragraph (a) of section 7 (1) of the Police Offences Act 1927 a person may be prosecuted for the offence of cruelty to an animal; and the owner of an animal also commits an offence if he permits it to be cruelly treated or to be caused unnecessary suffering. This Bill re-enacts that paragraph with the inclusion of new words which make it an offence for a person who is not the owner but has charge of an animal to permit it to be cruelly treated or to be caused unnecessary suffering. Such a person is already liable to prosecution under section 7 (1) (b) of the Act for the separate offence of failing to supply an animal with food, water, or shelter.

"(a) Cruelly beats, kicks, ill-treats, overrides, overdrives, overloads, tortures, infuriates, or terrifies any animal; or causes or procures 15 any animal to be so used; or, being the owner or having the charge of any animal, permits it to be so used; or by wantonly or unreasonably doing or omitting to do any act, or causing or procuring the commission 20 omission of any act, causes unnecessary suffering to any animal, or. being the owner or having the charge of any animal, permits any unnecessary suffering to be so caused to it; or ". 25
