BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Payment of Members Short Title. Act, 1891." 2. This Act shall come into force on the first day of January, in Commencement. 10 the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two. 3. In this Act,— Interpretation. "Member" means a member of the Legislative Council or the House of Representatives, as the case may be: "Sitting day," where used in relation to the Legislative 15

Council or the members thereof, or to the House of Representatives or the members thereof, means every day on which such Legislative Council or House of Representatives respectively shall, during any session, be, by their Standing Orders, appointed to sit for the transaction of business.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Act, every member of the Annual sum pavable General Assembly shall be entitled to receive payment in relation to General Assembly. his attendance in the discharge of his parliamentary duties at the rate of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum if a member of the 25 Legislative Council, and two hundred and forty pounds per annum if a member of the House of Representatives.

And such payment shall be payable out of the Consolidated Fund by equal monthly payments on the last day of each and every month No. 91—1.

to members of the

in each year to every such member from the time of taking his seat until his resignation thereof, or otherwise vacating his seat, or, if a member of the House of Representatives, until his retirement therefrom by effluxion of time or the dissolution of Parliament, as the case may be.

Deduction in case of absence.

5. All payments to be made under the last-preceding section shall be subject to the provisions following, that is to say,—

(1.) If during any session any member shall absent himself for any number of sitting days exceeding five, there shall be deducted from the payment to be made to such member 10 for every sitting day (exclusive of such five sitting days) during which he may be absent, such sum as will bear a like proportion to the full amount payable to any member under this Act as one sitting day will bear to the whole number of sitting days in such session.

Deduction not to be made in case of (2.) The preceding provision as to the deduction to be made in the case of absence of any member in attendance on Parliament shall not apply where such absence is caused by reason of illness, or from any other cause which shall, by the Speaker of the House giving the certificate hereinafter 20 mentioned, be therein stated to be unavoidable.

Travellingallowance.

(3.) In addition to the payment aforesaid, there shall be paid to every member, as travelling-allowance, the actual sums which such member shall have reasonably paid in proceeding to and returning from the place of meeting of the 25 General Assembly: But such allowance shall be made only in respect of one journey to and from such place.

Payments on account of such allowance may be made

at any time after the same are payable.

Resignation and dissolution.

(4.) If a member of either House resigns or otherwise vacates 30 his seat, he shall be entitled to payment up to and inclusive of the day of the seat becoming vacated; and, on the dissolution of Parliament, members of the House of Representatives shall be entitled to payment up to and inclusive of the day of such dissolution.

Exemptions, as to Ministers, Speakers,

6. No payment under this Act, other than travelling-allowance as aforesaid to the Speakers and Chairmen of Committees hereinafter mentioned, shall be made to any member in respect of any session or in respect of any part of any session during which such member—

(1.) Holds and receives an official salary in respect of any one or 40 more of the Ministerial offices mentioned in the Third Schedule to "The Civil List Act 1863 Amendment Act, 1873," or any Ministerial office which may by law be substituted for or added to the offices mentioned in such Schedule; or

(2.) Is Speaker of the Legislative Council or of the House of Representatives respectively; or

(3.) Is Chairman of Committees of the said Council or of the House of Representatives respectively.

7. No payment shall be made to any member during session or 50 in respect of the month during which any prorogation occurs except upon the certificate of the Speaker of the House of which the person

No payments to be made without Speaker's certificate. claiming such payment shall be a member, and thereafter during any period of recess, except upon the certificate of the Clerk of the House aforesaid.

8. No payment under this Act shall be anticipated, nor be Payments not to 5 capable of being pledged or given in security in any way whatever, be anticipated, nor be liable to be seized or taken in execution under any process, in execution. or attached or charged in any way, under the order of any Court whatever.

9. "The Parliamentary Honorarium and Privileges Act, 1884," Repeal. 10 and "The Parliamentary Honorarium and Privileges Act 1884 Amendment Act, 1887," are hereby repealed.
