2. Elector to vote only in respect of one electorate.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to abolish Plurality of Voting at the Election of Members of the House of Representatives. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Plurality of Votes Act, 1883." Short Title.

2. (1.) From and after the passing of this Act no elector shall at any election of members of the House of Representatives vote in respect of more than one electorate. Elector to vote only in respect of one electorate.

(2.) At any other than a general election of such members no elector shall vote in respect of any electorate unless he shall have been entitled to vote and have voted in such electorate at the last general election held therein, or unless he has acquired the right to vote therein since the last general election in respect of a residential qualification under "The Qualification of Electors Act, 1879."
