PUBLIC RESERVES ACTS AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," and "The Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1889." Title

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Reserves Acts Amendment Act, 1893." Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," the Governor, by notification in the *Gazette*, may exchange any reserve set apart as a site for a school for any reserve of equal value comprised within Class I. Power to exchange one reserve for another.

Provided that no exchange as aforesaid shall be made except with the written consent of the Education Board who may have control of such school-site.

3. All reserves made under section two hundred and thirty-five of "The Land Act, 1892," as or for sites for public halls, dépôts and sites for rubbish, fences of all sorts, fishing-paths or other internal communications whether by land or by water, and forest reserves shall be deemed as coming within Class I. of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881." Certain reserves included in Class I.
