## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," and "The Title Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1889."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Par-5 liament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Reserves Acts Short Title. Amendment Act, 1893."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Public Re- Power to exchange serves Act, 1881," the Governor, by notification in the Gazette, may one reserve for 10 exchange any reserve set apart as a site for a school for any reserve

of equal value comprised within Class I.

Provided that no exchange as aforesaid shall be made except with the written consent of the Education Board who may have control of such school-site.

3. All reserves made under section two hundred and thirty-five Certain reserves 15 of "The Land Act, 1892," as or for sites for public halls, dépôts and included in Class I. sites for rubbish, fences of all sorts, fishing-paths or other internal communications whether by land or by water, and forest reserves shall be deemed as coming within Class I. of "The Public Reserves 20 Act, 1881."
