

PLUMBERS REGISTRATION AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE Plumbers Registration Act 1953 requires that all sanitary plumbing in prescribed districts shall be done by registered plumbers. "Sanitary plumbing" is defined in section 2 of the Act, and the effect of the definition is to exempt work done on gas or electrical water heaters in certain circumstances, and work done on electrical water heaters in certain other circumstances. The effect of this Bill is to include all water heaters within the existing exemption, so that, in the circumstances in which the exemption applies, registered plumbers will not be required for work to be done on any kind of water heater.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Plumbers Registration Act 1953. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Plumbers Registration Amendment Act 1955, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Plumbers Registration Act 1953 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title. 1953, No. 85

2. The definition of the expression "sanitary plumbing" in section two of the principal Act is hereby amended as follows: Definition of "sanitary plumbing" amended.

(a) By omitting from paragraph (i) the words "gas or electrical":

(c) By omitting from paragraph (iii) the word "electrical".
