A BILL INTITULED

- AN ACT to enable Provision to be made for a Colonial Scale of Title. Staff and Salaries for Teachers in Public Schools, and to make other Provisions respecting Public Schools.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public School Teachers' Short Title. Salaries Act, 1900"; and it shall form part of and be read together

10 with "The Education Act, 1877" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act.")

2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of commencement of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Act, Staff and salaries. 15 the number of teachers and pupil-teachers in every public school, and the salaries and allowances paid to the teachers and pupilteachers, shall be determined by regulations made under this Act.

4. Section eight of the principal Act, relating to the appropriation Appropriation of of moneys required in administer the Act, is hereby amended by moneys to Boards. 20 repealing subsection two thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof the following :-

"(2.) In payment to the Board of every district of a sum sufficient to pay the salaries and allowances of teachers and pupilteachers and grants to the School Committees in such district according to a scale prescribed by regulations, and to defray the general expenses of such Board."

5. Every Board shall make grants to the School Committees of Grants to School the district, for general educational purposes, of sums not less than Committees. according to a minimum scale prescribed by regulations.

6. Except within a borough no public school shall, after the New schools. 30 passing of this Act, be established within three miles of an existing public school without the approval of the Minister.

7. The Governor may from time to time make such regulations. Regulations. for carrying this Act into effect as he thinks fit.

8. The principal Act is hereby modified in so far as it conflicts Modification of Education Act. 35 with this Act, but not further.
