This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the Lmaislative Council for its concurrence.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to remove the existing Anomalies and Inequalities in the Title. Staffing of Public Schools and in the Salaries paid to PublicSchool Teachers.
5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. 'The Short Title of this Act is "The Public-School Teachers' short Title, Salaries Act, 1901 "; and it shall form part of and be read together
10 with "The Education Act, 1877 " (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act'").
2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, Commencement of one thousand nine hundred and two.
3. Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, the number Complement of

15 of teachers and pupil-teachers in every public school shall be such as teaching staff. is prescribed for the average attendance thereat in the First and Second Schedules hereto:

Provided that until the thirty - first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three, any Board may at its discretion
20 retain on the staff of any school any teacher for whom provision is made according to the scale in force in such district on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one:

Provided also that if it be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is inexpedient to bring this section into operation at
25 once it shall be lawful for a Board, with the sanction of the Minister previously obtained in writing, to make such modification in the staff of any school as may be agreed between the Board and the Minister but in no case shall the full operation of this section be postponed later than the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine
30 hundred and three, and in no case shall the salary payable to any teacher in such school be greater than as provided in section four hereof.

4. The salaries of the teachers and pupil-teachers in any public school shall be the salaries assigned to such teachers and pupilteachers in the First Schedule hereto:

Provided that, if the Governor at any time decides that the salaries in the Second Schedule hereto shall be payable in lieu of those in the First Schedule, he may, by Order in Council, declare that the salaries paid to teachers and pupil-teachers shall thereafter be the salaries named in the Second Schedule hereto:

Provided also that, at the discretion of the Education Board, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred 1 and three, the salary of any teacher in any school shall not be reduced below the salary that would be payable to such teacher according to the scale in force in such district on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one.
5. Section eight of the principal Act, relating to the appropriation of money required to administer the Act, is hereby amended by repealing subsection two thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof the following :-
(a.) In payment to the Board of every district of a sum sufficient to pay the salaries of teachers and pupil- 20 teachers in the district in accordance with this Act; and
(b.) In payment to the Board of every district of a sum of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum, together with a sum of eleven shillings and three pence per annum for 25 each child in average daily attendance at a public school :

Provided that the Governor may at any time, by Order in Council, declare that, in lieu of the payments last named, there shall be thereafter paid to the Board 30 of every district the sum of twelve shillings per annum for each child in average daily attendance; and, in addition, to every Board having less than eight thousand children in average daily attendance, a sum of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.
6. The arerage daily attendance shall be computed in manner prescribed by regulations.
7. In the case of a school having more than twenty children in average daily attendance, the Board shall at its discretion either provide a residence for the head-teacher of the school or pay to 40 him annually the house allowance prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.
8. It shall be lawful for a Board to pay rents of school-buildings or house allowances to head-teachers as provided by the last preceding section out of any moneys from time to time appropriated 45 by the General Assembly for that purpose.
9. Notwithstanding anything in this Act, it shall be lawful for any Board, with the sanction of the Minister, to make such additions to the staff of any district high school and to pay such additional sums as salaries to such staff as may be prescribed by regulations, 50 such payment to be made out of moneys appropriated by the General

Assembly for that purpose, and distributed to the Boards in accordance with such regulations:

Provided that the staff of such school shall, in regard to the children not receiving secondary instruction thereat, be as strong as if
5 the school were not a district high school.
10. The Guvernor in Council may from time to time make such Regulations. regulations for carrying this Act into effect as he thinks fit.
11. "The Public-School Teachers' Salaries Act, 1900" is hereby Repeal. repealed; and the principal Act is hereby modified in so far as it con10 ficts with this Act, but not further or otherwise.

In estimating salaries two half-tine schools shall count as one school, the totals of the average attendance at the two schools being added together; and if the teacher of two such half-time schools be required by the Education Board to teach on six days during the week his salary shall be increased by one-fifth of the salary shown in Part I. hereof.
