2. Toll-gates erected prior to passing of "The Public Works Act, 1894," deemed lawfully established in certain cases.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Public Works Act, 1894."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Works Act 1894 Amendment Act, 1897." Short Title.

10 2. Where any toll-gate has, prior to the passing of "The Public Works Act, 1894," been placed within one mile from the boundary of a borough, measuring in a straight line in a horizontal plane, but beyond one mile from such boundary measuring by the shortest road available for carriage-traffic leading from such boundary to the said toll-gate, such toll-gate shall be deemed to have been lawfully established, and all tolls collected thereat shall be deemed to have been lawfully demanded and collected. Toll-gates erected prior to passing of "The Public Works Act, 1894," deemed lawfully established in certain cases.
