This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

#### A BILL INTITULED

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money for Public Works Title. and Other Purposes.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—Whereas under the authority Address. 5 of several Acts in that behalf certain unexpended balances of loans raised or to be raised were, upon the thirty-first day of March, in the present year, standing to the credit of the three parts of the Public Works Fund, particularly described in "The Public Works Appropriation Act, 1887," that is to say, to the credit of Part I.

10 two hundred and thirty-three thousand six hundred and seventyfive pounds; to the credit of Part II., three hundred and eighty-six thousand nine hundred and eighty-five pounds; to the credit of Part III., four hundred and twenty-six thousand eight hundred and five pounds, and it is expedient that a portion of such sums severally 15 should be appropriated to the several purposes and services to

which the same are applicable: We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, have

resolved to grant unto Your Majesty, towards making good the Supply 20 which we have cheerfully granted to your Majesty in this session of Parliament, the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-25 lows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Works Appropria- Short Title. tion Act, 1890."

2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply— (1.) Out of the said balance of two hundred and thirty-three of £73,564.

thousand six hundred and seventy-five pounds standing to the credit of Part I., and in addition to the sum of one No. 135—2.

hundred and twelve thousand seven hundred and seven pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part I. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of seventy-three thousand five hundred and sixty-four pounds towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services mentioned in the Second Schedule:

Of £105,705.

(2.) And, out of the said balance of three hundred and eighty-six thousand nine hundred and eighty-five pounds standing to the credit of Part II., and in addition to the sum of 10 three thousand and ninety-five pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part II. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and five thousand seven hundred and five pounds towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services mentioned in the Third Schedule:

Of £196,360.

(3.) And, out of the said balance of four hundred and twenty-six thousand eight hundred and five pounds standing to the credit of Part III., and in addition to the sum of thirty-four 20 thousand five hundred and twenty-eight pounds authorised to be issued by the several Acts mentioned in Part III. of the First Schedule hereto, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and ninety-six thousand three hundred and sixty pounds 25 towards defraying the expenses of the several works and services mentioned in the Fourth Schedule.

Appropriation of grants.

3. All sums so issued shall be applied as mentioned in the several votes set forth in the first column in the Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules towards defraying so much of the expenses incurred 30 or to be incurred in the several works and services mentioned in the said Schedules as shall come in the course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and to no other purposes whatsoever.

Amount of liabilities which may be incurred.

4. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on 35 behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to enter into any contract or contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that the amount of liability so incurred in respect of each vote shall not, together with the sum appropriated by such vote, exceed the sum set 40 down in the second column in the Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules opposite to each vote severally.

Moneys may be issued after 31st March, 1891.

5. For the purpose of the ninth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1882," as amended by the third section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1883," the unexpended balance of any vote under this Act shall 45 be deemed to be the unexpended balance of the vote in the first column of the appropriations, together with an amount not exceeding one-fourth part of the difference between the amount of the vote and the amount to which the Government is authorised to enter into contracts under the provisions of this Act; and notwithstanding anything in "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," or any other Act, moneys

may be issued under the authority of this section after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

6. Nothing in this Act shall limit the authority of the Colonial Unauthorised Treasurer to issue and pay any moneys which he may be otherwise expenditure. 5 authorised to issue and pay under the authority of the forty-fourth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878."

7. And whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority Indemnity. of the forty-fourth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," issued from the Public Account, during the twelve months ended the 10 thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, moneys in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, amounting in the whole to twelve thousand two hundred and eightyseven pounds eighteen shillings and tenpence, and has applied the said sum to the several purposes and services mentioned in the Fifth 15 Schedule hereto annexed: Be it enacted that the application of the said sums is hereby sanctioned.

8. The moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of Moneys may be public roads, and such other public works as are usually constructed bodies for bodies for by or are under the control of local governing bodies, may be paid expenditure. 20 over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister for Public Works or other Minister, acting on his behalf, may determine, upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed upon between the said Minister and any such local governing body, to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appro-25 priated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments in accordance with any such agreement.
