PUBLIC WORKS AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Public Works Amendment Act, 1904." BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Public Works Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1905"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Public Works Act, 1894."

2. (1.) Section five of "The Public Works Amendment Act, Section 5 of Act of 10 1904," is hereby amended by repealing the words "forty feet," and 1904 amended. substituting in lieu thereof the words "sixty links."

(2.) Nothing in the said section five shall be deemed to authorise the registration of any transfer or conveyance on the sale of any land as mentioned in section two of "The Public Works Act, 1903," 15 unless and until the Registrar is satisfied that the requirements of subsection two of the last-mentioned section have been complied

with.

New clauses.

3. On the petition of not less than two-thirds of the owners Undedicated 20 having frontage on any unformed road of not less than sixty-six roads. feet in width, which had for five years or upwards prior to the year one thousand nine hundred been used as a public road, the local authority may form the same and apportion the cost thereof amongst the whole of the said owners in proportion to the frontage 25 held by them respectively, and may recover the amount so apportioned as if the same were a rate.

4. (1.) Where a local authority is of opinion that the carriage Power to forbid of any particular weight or the conduct of any particular kind of traffic will cause serious injury to a road or street, it may by public notice forbid such carriage or traffic unless the cost, as estimated by the local authority, of reinstating such road or street is previously paid to it.

(2.) Every person concerned in carrying a weight or conducting any traffic on a road or street in breach of the terms of such public notice is liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.

(3.) This section is in substitution for section twelve of "The Public Works Amendment Act, 1904," which section is hereby accordingly repealed:

Provided that this section shall not apply to any vehicle used
