A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Public Works Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and it shall form part of and be read together with the Public Works Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Anything in the Public Works Act, 1908, or any other Act to the contrary notwithstanding, where the configuration of any district is such that within any particular area or areas thereof it is difficult or inexpedient to construct a street or road of the width of not less than sixty-six feet, the local authority having control of the streets or roads within such area may by resolution so declare, and the Governor may by Order in Council permit and authorise the local authority to permit the construction of a street or road not being less than thirty feet in width, upon condition that no building shall be erected within thirty-three feet from the centre of such street or road.

3. The provisions of subsection three of section one hundred and seventeen of the principal Act shall apply to such resolution and Order in Council.
