A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to prevent the Practice of Quackery.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Quackery Prevention Act, 1908.

Short Title.

2. (1.) It shall not be lawful to advertise or supply any preparation, medicine, or appliance alleged to be for the prevention, alleviation, or cure of any human ailment or physical defect ~~that if~~ such preparation, medicine, or appliance is declared by a Judge of the Supreme Court, on the application of the Chief Health Officer, to be harmful to health, or of a fraudulent nature, or of such a character that it cannot have the effect claimed for it, or cannot effect the purpose for which it was supplied.

Illegal to advertise quack medicines.

15 *New subclause.*

(2.) The Governor may, by Order in Council gazetted, make such regulations as he deems necessary for carrying into full effect the provisions of this Act.

20 3. Every person who commits a breach of the provisions of this Act is liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds.
