RICCARTON BUSH AMENDMENT

Title.	1. Short Title.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to Amend the Riccarton Bush Act, 1914. Title.

WHEREAS it is desired to vest in the Riccarton Bush Trustees certain powers to let the building known as Riccarton House or any part thereof: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Riccarton Bush Amendment Act, 1949, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Riccarton Bush Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the principal Act or in any other Act, the Riccarton Bush Trustees are hereby authorized to let by private contract or otherwise, for periods not exceeding one year at any one time, the whole or any part or parts of the building known as Riccarton House, situated on the land described in the Second Schedule to the Riccarton Bush Amendment Act, 1947, together with ingress thereto and egress Power to let Riccarton House.

therefrom, for committee rooms, charity bazaars, fairs, or flower shows, or art or other cultural exhibitions, or for purposes concerned with the pursuit of health, instruction, or recreation, or for use for all or any of the following purposes—namely, community centre, crèche, kindergarten, tea-kiosk, museum, or art or culture centre. 5
